Food Service Managers \$28.13 Plan, direct, or coordinate activities of an organization or department that serves food and beverages.

Meeting, Convention, and Event Planners \$25.31 Coordinate activities of staff, convention personnel, or clients to make arrangements for group meetings, events, or conventions.

Chefs and Head Cooks \$24.10 Direct and may participate in the preparation, seasoning, and cooking of salads, soups, fish, meats, vegetables, desserts, or other foods. May plan and price menu items, order supplies, and keep records and accounts.

First-Line Supervisors/Managers of Food Preparation and Serving Workers \$17.86 Directly supervise and coordinate work activities of cleaning personnel in hotels, hospitals, offices, and other establishments.

Cooks, Institution and Cafeteria \$15.99 Prepare and cook large quantities of food for institutions, such as schools, hospitals, or cafeterias.

Cooks, Restaurant \$14.29 Prepare, season, and cook dishes such as soups, meats, vegetables, or desserts in restaurants. May order supplies, keep records and accounts, price items on menu, or plan menu.

Janitors and Cleaners $\$ 14.67$ Keep buildings in clean and orderly condition. Perform heavy cleaning duties, such as cleaning floors, shampooing rugs, washing walls and glass, and removing rubbish. Duties may include tending furnace and boiler, performing routine maintenance activities, notifying management of need for repairs, and cleaning snow or debris from sidewalk.

Maids and Housekeeping Cleaners \$12.93 Perform any combination of light cleaning duties to maintain private households or commercial establishments, such as hotels and hospitals, in a clean and orderly manner. Duties may include making beds, replenishing linens, cleaning rooms and halls, and vacuuming.

Bakers \$14.44 Mix and bake ingredients to produce breads, rolls, cookies, cakes, pies, pastries, or other baked goods.
